William Rhoden calls on the athletes

Student-athletes heard a refreshing message from an award-winning columnist on Thursday — go out and lead. William Rhoden, a New York Times sports columnist and Emmy award-winning writer, spoke about the relationship between athletics and sport at the Sonja Haynes Stone Center for Black Culture and History for its annual Diaspora Lecture.

Rhoden spoke about the creation of the Stone Center in 2001 after the heated political battle between a group of UNC athletes and former Chancellor Paul Hardin over the need for a free-standing black cultural center on campus.

"Sports has become the major cultural pillar of

American culture — whether you like it or not. There are a lot of kids who are watching ESPN 24/7, and because of that, athletes are in a position to lead the struggle, as they did here in 1991," Rhoden said.

"But that takes courage. And while many of our athletes have that courage on the football field or basketball court, some don't have the political courage."

The Stone Center has been planning on sponsoring a lecture by Rhoden for nearly three years, said Joseph Jordan, director of the Stone Center.

"We invited him back in 2011, in 2012 and he wasn't able to come," Jordan said. "Fortunately he is now working with an agent and that agent is a UNC grad."

Jordan said the Center

wanted Rhoden to speak because he would fit in with its diaspora lecture series on black popular culture.

"We've had at times former UNC athletes talking about the black athlete in sports," Jordan said. "He was just a person we know that has been covering these issues for some times and thought he might have some interesting perspectives."

Having Rhoden speak last night only cost the Stone Center \$1,500, Jordan said.

"His fee is \$5,000 — he knocked off \$3,500 because he likes us," Jordan said. "The Stone Center almost never pays above that. We try to be particularly careful with the funds we receive, and almost all our speakers come for around that amount or less without charging us a fee."

Rhoden said black athletes

struggle to get respect and, like Adrian Peterson and Ray Rice, are often made scapegoats of sports scandals.

Rhoden also discussed "Jockey Syndrome" — named after the successful black horse jockeys of the early 20th century because of their race.

"It describes white resentment of black success. The 'Jockey Syndrome' is a historical phenomenon that occurs when the powers that be attempt to change rules when the opponents begin to gain ground," Rhoden said.

Junior Allison Newton attended Rhoden's lecture after following his column.

"I appreciated his honesty and realism. Just saying exactly what things are about — being open about them," Newton said.

Rhoden, in the end, gave the audience a question to ponder, regarding the realm of current college athletics.

"Do the universities appreciate the need for these young

people to understand the struggle, the fight for these students to be at these universities in the first place?"

UNC, Duke join to push healthy eating

A new center will help educate families on food stamps.

As millions of families on food stamps nationwide struggle to eat healthily, UNC and Duke University have launched a collaborative effort to educate these families about proper nutrition.

The effort will take the form of a new research center, which has been given a three-year, \$1.9 million grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Currently one in seven people in the U.S. is on the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, or SNAP. The number of people on SNAP has doubled since 2007.

Susan Deans, a program consultant in the N.C. Department of Health and Human Services, said the USDA is responsible for providing guidance to state social services agencies and deciding which foods can be purchased with the benefits.

People on food stamps often lack education on healthy eating, said Jill Brown, director of nutrition education at the Inter-Faith Food Shuttle, a Triangle-area advocacy group that promotes healthy eating on a low budget.

"People want to know how to shop on a budget," Brown said. "They don't know how to shop on a budget for the recipes they want to use."

The Duke-UNC center will show people on SNAP what foods to buy and how to make eating healthy a fun activity, said Alice Ammerman, director of the UNC Center for Health Promotion and Disease Prevention.

"(The center) promotes healthier eating and a healthier lifestyle by giving people the flexibility to make healthier choices," Ammerman said.

The center will function as a collaborative effort between the two universities. Ammerman said each school offers different methods of tackling the disconnect between low-income families and healthy eating.

"There are strengths that can be seen from both universities," she said. "Duke does a lot more of the groundwork. We work a lot with people on the SNAP program to understand what drives their behavior."

SNAP is different from another federal food stamp program called Women, Infants and Children, which gives stamps for a certain

number of select foods.

"The problem is that with WIC, there is more of an incentive for the stores to charge more instead of focusing on nutrition," Ammerman said. "SNAP has been an improvement because it is based more on income, whereas WIC is very prescriptive."

SNAP has lifted 4.9 million people above the poverty line with its benefits, and the program has stimulated the economy by \$1.79 for every federal dollar allocated to it.

Though SNAP offers more flexibility to people on food stamps, there are still issues that Duke and UNC are addressing. The universities are looking at the behavioral economics of food stamps.

"(It's) the notion of nudging people in the direction that you want them to go," Ammerman said. "It is being used for people to adopt healthier behaviors because it is more convenient or more fun."

Botanical gardens job draws 3

The search for a new director of the North Carolina Botanical Garden has narrowed to three applicants — each of whom will visit UNC in the coming month and discuss their plans for the garden.

Todd Boyette, director of the Morehead Planetarium, is part of the selection process. He said the new director should be a recognized leader in botany and capable of overseeing the staff and operations of the garden.

"They have to have lots of experience in administration and leadership in organizations similar to the botanical gardens," he said.

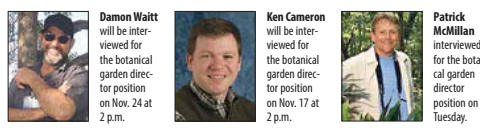
The botanical garden is up for review by the UNC Board of Governors. When it comes to how the review will effect the director position, Boyette said he isn't concerned.

"I'd be shocked if anybody concluded that the botanical garden position doesn't align with the mission of UNC-Chapel Hill."

Candidate Patrick McMillan is currently a professor at Clemson University and the director of the South Carolina Botanical Garden. He also is the producer of the self-titled, Emmy award-winning program, "Expeditions with Patrick McMillan."

"I'm a graduate of UNC," he said. "My whole undergraduate career I spent studying in the arboretum and botanical gardens. I have a deep, deep connection to the place and that makes it home."

McMillan said he would



focus on bringing public interest to the garden if given the position.

Another candidate, Ken Cameron, is currently a professor in the department of botany at the University of Wisconsin in Madison and director of the state herbarium.

What drew him to the position, like McMillan, was his alumni status.

"I've always kept my eye on things happening down there, and I'm committed to keeping the discipline of plant botany strong and alive and moving forward," he said. "UNC is one of the leaders in the country

Erwin Terrace and its neighborhood are an example of how property conditions can change.

Currently, Erwin Terrace consists of two buildings, opened in 2004 and accommodating retail, restaurants, offices and residential apartments at the corner of Erwin Road and LaSalle Street. Previously, the site was occupied by the early-1950s Poplar Apartments.

Current zoning, approved in 1999, allows for about 300,000 square feet of building, said company partner Robinson Everett Jr.; with what is already there, the owners could build about 94,000 square feet more.

Since then, though, city and county policy has increasingly encouraged density and the Erwin Road corridor between Fulton Street and Morreene Road has boomed thanks to proximity to the VA Hospital and the Duke Medical Center.

“We’ve become the least dense along this corridor when 15 years ago, in Durham’s eye, it was a pretty dense and ambitious proposal,” Everett said.

DURHAM — A light-rail line between Durham and Chapel Hill is still a hypothetical thing, and a decade or more away from running its first train, but some developers are already getting ready.

Case in point: Erwin Terrace Limited Partnership, which owns the mixed-use buildings right across Erwin Road from one of the proposed rail stations and has a lot more in mind, with light rail a contributing factor.

Erwin Terrace Limited Partnership has also encountered another factor that will affect any other developers with projects close to transit station sites: Durham’s demand for “affordable” housing.

Both factors came up during a rezoning hearing at the Durham Planning Commission last week, likely a foretaste of things to come.

The rezoning and land-use plan changes would allow Erwin Terrace’s owners to add up to 322 residences, 268,000 square feet of offices and 193,000 square feet of commercial space to the two mixed-use buildings already on their site at Erwin Road and LaSalle Street – adding to the density of residents and workers with easy access to stations that is important for the light-rail line to draw riders.

“To do what’s right for Durham you have to plan for the potential rail,” said Erwin Terrace partner Robinson Everett Jr. Still, he said, “being across from the research corridor and the hospital, there are certain things that fit regardless of the rail.”

Commissioners had heard the plans for enlarging Erwin Terrace in August, but put off a vote for two months, concerned that the developers made no commitment to include affordable units among the new apartments they planned.

City and county governments want at least 15 percent of all housing units within a half mile of each transit station to be “affordable to families with income less than 60 percent of area median income.”

(Currently, 60 percent of AMI is \$35,550; affordable rent is \$787 per month, according to the city-county planning department.)

With that in mind, city-county planners made Erwin Terrace and the surrounding “LaSalle Street Transit Area” a pilot for development near the 10 Durham stations along the light-rail route.

Their analysis made affordable housing at Erwin Terrace, in effect, a moot point – since they found that the proportion of affordable rental housing in the LaSalle station area is currently almost 80 percent.

“That’s over five times the stated goal,” said Erwin Terrace partner Robinson Everett Jr., whose father, Robinson Everett Sr., founded a statewide advocacy group for low-income housing in the 1960s.

“He advocated tirelessly in Durham and across the state for affordable housing when few talked about it,” Everett said.

“We are not some out-of-town, get-rich-quick developers who do not care about this issue,” he said.

Everett said he agreed with the city’s and county’s goal, but said forcing developers to build affordable housing is “neither fair nor effective” and the governments need to provide “a toolbox of incentives.”

That’s being worked on, he said, but in the immediate case of Erwin Terrace expansion, affordable housing does not fit.

“Any construction on this site ... would be extremely expensive and a huge financial risk,” Everett continued. “Adding on a new affordable housing mandate ... is unreasonable.”

The city and county have no authority to require affordable housing, developers’ attorney Patrick Byker pointed out. Affordable housing advocates, though, were hoping for a voluntary commitment.

“I realize ... there is no mandate for you to include it but we know it is being done in other communities, very successfully,” said Selena Mack, director of the Durham Community Land Trustees.

“It’s a great opportunity for Durham and for the developer to be able to provide housing for all the people who are going to be living and working in that area,” said Lorisa Seibel, speaking for a citizens’ coalition promoting affordable housing near transit stops, “and to commit to keeping that housing ... affordable long term.”

Mixing affordable housing and mass transit are going to be a long-term concern, several commissioners said.

“While it’s great there’s the 79.5 percent affordable housing currently near this transit zone ... we know over time there will be enormous pressure, good pressure, on rents,” Commissioner Brian Buzby said.

“So if we want to achieve the 15 percent over time ... it’s going to be something we’re going to need to really grapple with,” Buzby said.

Public comments will help planners settle Orange-Durham light rail route

DURHAM — At three days of public meetings this week, Triangle Transit planners are asking residents for help in making a few decisions about a planned 17-mile light rail-line from UNC Hospitals in Chapel Hill to Duke University and downtown Durham.

Orange and Durham county residents are contributing a share of local sales taxes to beef up bus service and plan for the light-rail line. But it can't be built unless state and federal agencies agree to pay most of the cost, estimated at \$1.34 billion in 2012 dollars – and those decisions are several years away.

Most of the route has been laid out, along with locations for most of the 17 train stations. The electric-powered light-rail trains would run on new tracks from UNC, heading east along N.C. 54, north near Interstate 40 to U.S. 15-501, then east into downtown Durham, ending at Alston Avenue near N.C. Central University.

But Triangle Transit officials are relying on feedback from residents of both counties to help settle some lingering questions:

- Whether to send the trains through the Meadowmont neighborhood near the Orange-Durham county line, or along N.C. 54. Meadowmont was designed to incorporate a future rail line, but some residents want to keep the trains out.
- Where to cross New Hope Creek. Environmentalists criticized an early plan that would run through wetlands. A less invasive path along U.S. 15-501 has drawn objection from businesses.
- Whether to put a station in front of the VA Hospital and the Duke Hospital Eye Center on Erwin Road, or move it a few blocks east to Trent Drive.
- Where to locate a 16- to 20-acre rail operation and maintenance center.
- And whether to build the light-rail line.

Claudia Markey, who retired to Durham with her husband a few weeks ago, likes the prospect of a light-rail stop at the Patterson Place shopping center off U.S. 15-501, not far from her townhouse apartment.

"We're already thinking about taking the train downtown to see a show at DPAC," said Markey, 63. "The

thing is, you never want it in your backyard – but you want it close enough to use it.”

Dozens of residents turned out for the first two meetings Tuesday in Durham and Chapel Hill. The final two meetings are:

- 4 to 7 p.m. Wednesday, SpringHill Suites, 5310 McFarland Drive in Durham (south of U.S. 15-501 off Mount Moriah Road).
- 4 to 7 p.m. Thursday, Hayti Heritage Center, 804 Old Fayetteville St. in Durham.

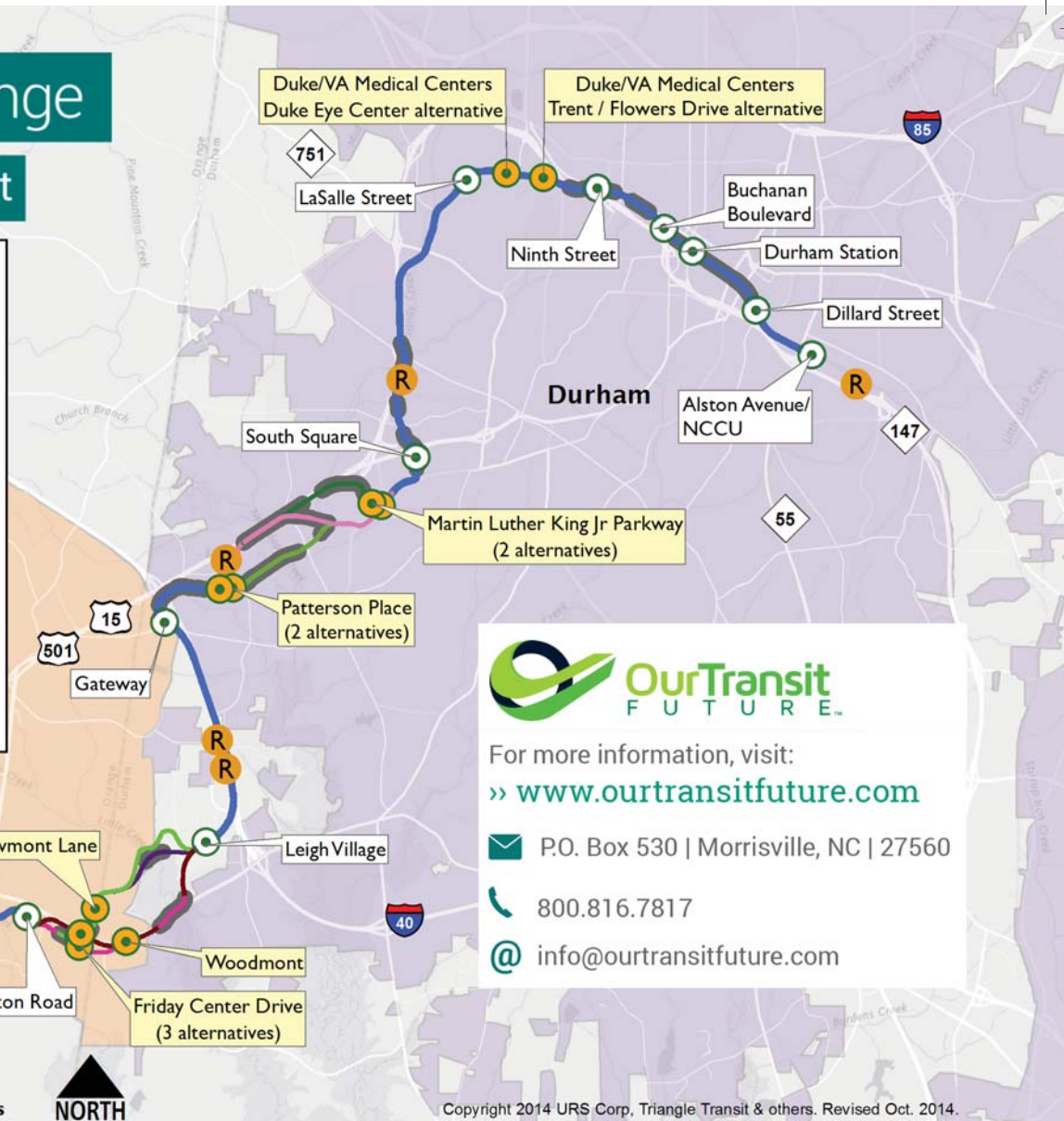
